Zeitenwende for Homeland Security

Strategy – Resilience – Solidarity

'Security' is the buzzword of the moment, but it needs a facelift, an update or a *Zeitenwende*. Police forces have always acted as the key to the security structure of the western alliance of values. They are the central building block for Homeland Security in Germany and Europe. Politicians have recognised as well that an open-minded and liberal security policy involves more than just prosecuting criminal offences on the ground. It requires cooperation between Homeland and overall National Security authorities as well as a security-compliant and legally secure foundation.

The latent dangers mentioned in the current constitutional protection report have become visible on Germany's streets. One strategic response was for a reason to reject people with a migration background directly at the EU's external borders. The EU migration pact concluded in spring 2024 stipulates that asylum seekers with little prospect of being recognised should not be allowed to enter the EU in the first place and, in return, states without an external border would take in migrants or provide financial support. With the tightening of controls at Germany's internal borders – but also France's since the Olympic Games – a new dispute has flared up. Some countries want to cancel the pact that has just been adopted. However, the European Court of Justice has declared the generalised rejection practice illegal. German experts are calling for clear legal regulations for the Federal Police.

Nonetheless, not only these officers, but also the customs and regulatory authorities criticise (in addition to staff shortages) the legal uncertainty. In the fight against financial crime, loopholes in criminal and regulatory law can thwart successful investigations if no charges can be pressed in the end. In addition to the full utilisation of possible penalties by the courts, tougher penalties in numerous areas of law are being demanded. Last but not least, the topic of data protection under certain conditions – such as an amendment to the Telecommunications Act – is being politically addressed more broadly than it was a few years ago.

Hybrid threats also require increased cooperation between the security authorities in the investigation and defence against terrorism, espionage and disinformation.

The issue of Homeland Security, which has been a conservatively presumptuous topic in the past, has become a top priority due to the political situation in Europe. The new European Commission has committed itself as well to 'security' for the coming term of office.

One thing is clear: the legal framework for Homeland Security is based on democratic principles along the axiom of 'freedom through security'. The shift to the right within the European Union and also in Germany requires strategic and resilient solutions – a *Zeitenwende* for Homeland Security.

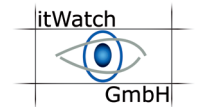
