Balancing Protection and Law Enforcement –

Future Policing Solutions

Protecting the population and consistent law enforcement must be reconciled with the current social polarisation and hybrid threat situation. Above all else is the need to ensure long-term security.

Following the focus on the armed forces, the police are also facing questions that require new answers: securing public spaces, cross-border organised crime, cybercrime, AI-supported disinformation campaigns and maintaining everyday police enforcement services. All of this becomes a challenge in dynamic crisis situations, when the legal situation is unclear and when there are technological developments on the perpetrator side.

Political radicalisation, social tensions and a growing loss of trust in state institutions are also expressions of profound social and cultural upheavals. These developments have a direct impact on the work of the police – both operationally and in terms of strategic orientation. The police need political commitment and tactical capabilities to remain effective.

A key topic at the 2026 congress will be ensuring security in public spaces: railway stations, schools, large events – everyday places are scenes of potential danger. Prevention and repression go hand in hand here: from video surveillance and digital early warning systems to community policing; from structural measures to international cooperation on cross-border crime. Although security and protection begin with education, they continue with a view to consistent law enforcement.

In 2026, European asylum policy faces the challenge of reconciling security and humanity. In view of increasing migration flows and geopolitical tensions, the need for a common European strategy to manage and limit irregular migration is becoming ever more urgent.

The debate oscillates between security interests and ethical principles. It shows how complex and multifaceted the design of a sustainable asylum policy is – and how important it is to preserve European values such as solidarity, the rule of law and humanity, even in difficult times.

Last but not least, critical infrastructures – from energy supply and healthcare to transport and communications – must be better protected. However, they are increasingly becoming the target of cyber and drone attacks, which not only cause economic damage but also jeopardise public safety.

A holistic understanding of security is needed to ensure the resilience of state structures and thus also the population's confidence in their effectiveness, but also to do justice to the police officers themselves.

Let us use the European Police Congress to think beyond borders, learn from each other and shape the police force of the future together – with courage, responsibility and a clear focus on the security and trust of our society.
